

February Second Saturday Scuba (S3)

- Breakwater Wall

Dippers **Barbara Davis, Anton Dold, Tom Gardner, Howard Timoney,** and **Brian Zaugg**, plus prospective members **Grace Chi** and **Manuel Mangrobang** met up in the Breakwater parking lot on Saturday, January 16th. (The S3 dive had been moved out a week because of the Awards Banquet.) The wave models had been way up earlier in the week, but they were trending down for the weekend so we were hoping for a couple of good dives. We decided to dive the Breakwater Wall since we had done a few dives along the pipe out to the metridiums recently.

We were pleasantly surprised to find very clear water in the shallows. From the surface we spotted the anchor sticking out of the sand just past the #5 on the wall and when we descended around #8, we could see the bottom from the surface (about 30 feet down).

Horizontal viz underwater was closer to the usual not-so-clear 15 feet, but we weren't looking for great vistas anyway. Several of us made it to the end of the Breakwater and were entertained by a number of sea lions twirling about.

Bizarre, two-legged fish whose bite is as fast as a speeding bullet found in New Zealand

Two New Zealand snorkelers were mystified when coming across a bizarre, all-black, two-legged fish on a white seafloor in a bay near Auckland. So James Beuvink, 20, and his girlfriend, Claudia Howse, 19, scooped up the specimen and put it into the boat's livewell where it started slowly walking around, according to Fairfax Media. "It had these little legs ... I'd never seen anything like it," Beuvink told Fairfax Media. "It was pretty chilled out. It's not the biggest fish I've ever caught, but it was certainly the strangest."

They eventually sent the fish to the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa in Wellington, New Zealand, where collection manager Andrew Stewart examined it and put photos of it on Facebook, where it started gaining world-wide attention. In an email to GrindTV, Stewart identified the specimen as a striped anglerfish, also popularly known as a striped frogfish.

"The last time this species was sent to us was 2008, which gives you an idea of how 'rare' they are here," Stewart wrote. "Elsewhere, the striped anglerfish is very common especially in the tropical and subtropical waters from the Atlantic, Indian and Pacific Oceans.

Along the way out and back along the wall we spotted a good-sized cabezon and some ling cod. We saw a tiny (live!) abalone, and also a larger one under a big rock. Barbara tried to feed it some kelp but it didn't appear interested. We also saw quite a few good-sized scallops and several types of crabs.

For the second dive, Grace wanted to look for nudibranchs and she and Barbara found a bunch, including a large rainbow nudibranch (*Dendronotus iris*) chowing down on a tube-dwelling anemone in the sand. We also spotted a pile of leafy hornmouth snails (*Ceratostoma foliatum*) generating masses of yellow eggs.

We had some sunshine at the end of the first dive, but then it clouded up again. Exiting after the second dive we noticed a lot more energy in the water and some bigger waves, but everyone got out ok. Depending on whose dive computer you looked at, the water temp was anywhere from 51 to 55 degrees. And since our max depth was only about 45 feet, several of us had dive times of over an hour.

So we had two really nice dives, followed by a hearty lunch at the Bulldog British pub. Some divers avoid the Breakwater Wall because it is such a popular place for open water class check-out dives, but they are missing out.

Diving the Breakwater . . . It's Not Just for Classes! ☆

"The Frogfishes family (*Antennariidae*) are rare in our waters and seem to be at their southern limits of tolerance, water temperature-wise. They are taken as single captures, and have only been found along the east coast of the northern North Island."

What struck Stewart as "very unusual" was the fact this striped frogfish was completely black. They are often brightly colored.

"This is the first time I've seen one jet-black, with no body markings at all," Stewart told Fairfax Media.

"This particular species is strongly striped, and those stripes extend inside the mouth. So even when it's sneaking up and its mouth is open, its prey just doesn't get an inkling of what's about to happen to it."

That's because of the incredible speed at which it can catch prey. "Frogfishes have the fastest bite of any vertebrate," the Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa wrote on its Facebook page. "Their mouths expand at the speed approaching a .22 rifle bullet — and that's in a medium 800x denser than air."

The lure on its dorsal fin is used to attract smaller fish, which won't know what hit them when the frogfish decides to strike. It opens its mouth, swallows its prey and closes its mouth again all in six milliseconds. ☆
