

# A July Third Saturday Scuba (TSS) - MacAbee Beach

Te rescheduled the July 8th Second Saturday Scuba (S3) dive to the following Saturday (July 15th) and Dippers Tristan Chutka, Barbara Davis, Carl Tuttle, and Sim Upadhyayula, met up at North Monastery Beach to scope out the conditions. The surf was up, so we relocated to South Monastery Beach. While conditions there did look diveable, we decided we were looking for a more mellow experience and headed over to MacAbee beach instead. Several other dive groups had the same idea and parking was packed! Since it was still early, we elected to park in the lot across the street from El Torito, where the earlybird rate was only \$10 for the

We swam out to the edge of the kelp field and picked a compass heading that would take us at an angle through the kelp forest. There was a murky green layer at the surface, but below that, viz opened up to 20-30 feet. And as most Monterey divers know, clear water means COLD water! depth of 42 feet during our 48 minute dive.

During the surface interval, Barbara marveled at the drysuit diver parked next to her SUV as he managed to pack his dive gear back into his BMW Z3 convertible!

Carl elected to sit out the second dive, due to an ear equalizing issue on the first dive, but Barbara, Sim and Tristan were up for it. This time, as we reached the edge of the kelp patch, we noticed 2 boats anchored a bit farther out. Maybe they were anchored at MacAbee Pinnacle? We took a compass heading towards one of the boats and found the Pinnacle! It was an amazing dive. We saw some metridium anemones, male and female California sheephead, lots of anemones and nudibranchs and saw a sea otter swim by. On this dive we reached a depth of 60 feet with a dive time of 47 minutes.

At the beginning of the dive, there was another group of divers heading for the kelp just ahead of us. As we waited for them to descend, we noticed they had several cameras. The next day, Barbara found a video posted in one of the Monterey divers Facebook groups that looked just like both our dives! With a few comments, we realized that these were the other divers we saw! Since our group did not have any underwater cameras, it was great that these divers shared their dive video so we could share it with friends as well.

Carl waited for us to finish the dive and after changing out of our gear we all walked up a couple of blocks and enjoyed a great lunch at Hula Grill, where the waitress brought Sim a special hot sauce to enjoy. •




to a Costco in Reno where he acquired a new battery and headed off to his home in Eugenie, OR.

# Two Dives: Breakwater & San Carlos Beach

n Sunday, July 2nd, Barbara Davis, Grace Chi, Taylor Sullivan, Sim Upadhyayula and Ken Agur got together for a couple of dives. The first dive was out to the Metridium field via 'The Pipe' a very traditional dive at the Breakwater. This was a good dive, as we found the pipe quickly with the visibility about 20 feet, the water temperature was about 51°F, and the maximum depth at about 50 feet. Lots of the usual suspects for this dive. The traditional second dive at the Breakwater is usually out along 'The Wall' but the Dippers decided there were a lot of students over there and perhaps we'd try something different. So for the second dive we went back to the pipe and headed north(ish) towards MacAbee Beach for a bit then we did a u-turn back over the pipe and over to the middle reef. This was an excellent choice and everyone really enjoyed it. Visibility was about 25 feet, and the maximum depth was about 45 feet. After everyone got out of their gear and into dry cloths, we walked over to the pier, picked up some sandwiches and had a picnic under a tree near the marina with our two non-divers, Emily Agur and Jing Ye. It was a beautiful day in the sun and another really good couple of dives with a great group of divers.



# Traveling to international dive sites? Undercurrent

Want to Dive with Sudafed in Mexico? Be Careful. It is illegal in Mexico to possess over-the-counter drugs that contain pseudoephedrine (such as Actifed, Sudafed, and Vicks inhalers). If you're caught entering with them, they will be confiscated, and you may be arrested (pseudoephedrine is meth's key ingredient). However, if you have a medical prescription, you may carry prescribed drugs; the prescription requires the name of the doctor, his/her signature, contact details, and professional registration, all translated into Spanish. You may carry only the amount you need during your stay. You should also inform your airline before traveling. See here for details.

Don't Overdo the Antibiotics. Otorhinolaryngologist Paul Neis, MD (Mountain Home, AR), wrote in response to a subscriber comment about treating a swimmer's ear with antibiotic ear drops (Undercurrent March), "It is always possible for a bacterium to have resistance to whatever antibiotic you choose. It would be better to apply an over-the-counter ear-drying drop with alcohol and acetic acid or mix your own with rubbing alcohol and vinegar. The alcohol will kill any bacteria, and the acidification deters the bacteria and fungi."

Don't Check Your Lithium Battery for a Flight. It's safer to carry lithium batteries in a carry-on rather than in the hold of an aircraft because, if a fire started, passengers would be alert to the burning smell in the passenger compartment. This is what happened on March 1: the cabin of a Spirit Airlines flight from Texas filled with smoke and diverted safely to Jacksonville, FL, proving the good sense of airline regulations. When you fly, you cannot check spare batteries. You must carry them with you, but consider carrying all items with batteries.

## Rare deep sea creature

ontentedly full from its last meal, a mysterious

Usea creature swam through the royal blue depths off the coast of Costa Rica. Twirling and spiraling, the misshapen animal moved in a mesmerizing way. Perhaps the sea creature noticed the metallic submersible that stopped nearby, or perhaps not. The scientists on the other side of the submersibles'

cameras definitely noticed — and dropped everything to watch the "extremely rare" moment.

Researchers with the Schmidt Ocean Institute piloted a remotely operated vehicle to explore

octopuses along the Dorado Outcrop near Costa Rica, the institute said in a news release. While surfacing from their last dive, they spotted an un-

expected animal: a gulper eel.

Gulper eels, also known as pelican eels, are known for their "large, scoop-like jaw" which they can expand to swallow prey, according to the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution. This particular gulper eel "had

very recently eaten," the institute said. Its "balloon-like" stomach was still inflated with undigested prey, potentially a "squid or swarm of shrimp."

Surreal video footage shows the gulper eel

swimming. Its meal hangs in a triangular bulge near its head, the rest of its long, skinny body extending behind. The eel almost looks like a cross between a ribbon and a torpedo as it moves and turns.

Eventually, the shape-shifting eel vanishes into the shadowy distance, the video shows. "We all stopped our conversation to gather around the monitor together to watch this amazing animal," Beth Orcutt, the vice president of research at the Bigelow Laboratory for Ocean Sciences, an organization involved in the research project, told McClatchy News. "Getting to glimpse this extremely rare animal behavior in the final moments of our last dive was an affirmation of the amazing deepsea biodiversity in Costa Rica's waters," Orcutt said.
