Mother Nature had other plans . . .

The Flipper Dippers' scheduled Pt. Lobos dive for Wednesday, December 27, was canceled due to unsafe conditions with the swell building to 11feet by the morning. After monitoring the National Weather Service, the Monterey Bay NOAA Buoy, the Coastal Data Information Program (CDIP) and the Windy App, coordinator Carl Tuttle sent out an email to the 14 individuals who were on the list canceling the dive. A large storm was generating 30-foot swells that were headed towards the coast! Unfortunately reservations for diving Pt. Lobos are non-refundable unless the whole park is closed - which it was on Thursday. But as his wife, Leigh, told him, "It's better to loose the \$20 than loose your life!" A Thursday screen capture (above) from the webcam on the 18th green at Pebble Beach Golf Links, shows it was the right call to make. Although it was a disappointment, it's Safety First! Another day, another dive. See more on page 5.

Stars will be awarded in numerical order upon completion of all previous requirements. It is the Club member's responsibility to make sure these accomplishments are recorded with the Star Achievement Program Chairperson. Chances are, you already qualify for your first or second 'Star' and don't know it. Review the list below – and you're on your way! - Show SCUBA certification from a nationally recognized certification agency.
- 2. Log ten (10) dives with the Club.
- 3. Dive to 60 feet in the ocean on a Club dive.

- 1. Log 20 total dives (not necessarily Club dives).
- 2. Have current CPR AND First Aid certification.
- 3. Coordinate two (2) scheduled Club dives.

 Navigation Specialty, <u>OR</u> b) Advanced Diver certification.

- 3. Complete at least one (1) of the following: a) assist at four (4) club activities, b) coordinate four (4) scheduled Club dives, <u>OR</u> c) dive with four (4) prospective Club members.
- 4. Have current CPR AND First Aid certification.
- 5. Show certification of one (1) of the following courses: a) O2 Provider, b) Nitrox, <u>OR</u> c) Advanced Diver.

- Complete two (2) years as an active skin and SCUBA diver AND Club member.
- 2. Log at least two (2) night dives.

 Diver, <u>OR</u> e) serve one (1) year as a Club Officer.






December swell cancels Pt. Lobos dive

The ocean was not very inviting for the Club's dive on December 27th. Images from a number of websites showing the waves pounding the Monterey coast making for unsafe

diving. The swell continued thru the weekend and into the new year. Significant wave heights are off the chart and crashing waves at the 18th green at Pebble Beach – with Still Water cove in the background wasn't so still over a number of days. ②














More Titanic Artifacts

Among the more interesting and seemingly out of place artifacts to be found at Titanic's wreck site is this ornate electric cabin heater, which today rests tucked in amongst deck equipment in the port side corner of the ship's forward well deck.

Five hundred electric heaters in addition to the ship's central steam heat kept Titanic's passengers well regulated in their own staterooms, lavatories being supplied with 750 watt models while staterooms themselves were generally furnished with models of 1,000 watts.

This 2,000 watt example was supplied only to a few choice rooms, including one installed in Captain Smith's private sitting room, from which this heater is thought most likely to have originated (see comments for diagram). It has been suggested that the force of impact with the sea floor



by the bow section of the vessel and the corresponding onrush of seawater which destroyed much of the ship's bridge likely plucked this sturdy artifact from its mounting on the starboard side Boat Deck, depositing the heater in its present position three decks below.

Oceanographic Magazine Photographer of the Year

The much-anticipated winners of the Ocean Photographer of the Year 2023 have been revealed. This year's winning photographs reveal the full spectrum of ocean life through a wealth of drone, land and underwater images. They include a stunning blackwater shot, a skilful anemone portrait, as well as a shocking image of a whale in peril. A total of nine categories were judged, with the overall winner crowned the Ocean Photographer of the Year 2023.

Ocean Conservation Photographer (Hope): Sylvie Ayer, Florida

Amanatee enjoys the crystal-clear waters of the Homosassa River. Photographer Sylvie Ayer explains: "The manatee on the picture came close to look at me and was suddenly perfectly positioned in front of the sun's rays. I hope this photo helps raise awareness of the need to protect these mammals. In Florida several hundred manatees die annually because there isn't enough food due to river pollution."



Ocean Wildlife Photographer: Jack Stefan Pokoj, Philippine

A lizardfish's open mouth reveals its last meal. "It seemed like the lizardfish was trying to swallow the other fish with its tail first before it got stuck" remembers photographer Jack Stefan Pokoj. "Both fish looked to be in some distress. The behaviour was unusual as lizardfish are ambush predators and swim away if a diver gets too close. This one kept its mouth open like it was trying to allow the fish inside its mouth to escape."
